




Business Case Offering

A business case provides an evidence-based, transparent and structured means to developing the justification to change from an organisation's status quo. NHS requirements for a business case are in accordance with HM Treasury's Five Case Model, and are aligned with the NHS organisation's governance requirements and external reviewer / approver requirements / checklists.

The Business Case and Business Change Process



Failure to adequately scope, justify and plan the implementation of a project can have significant negative consequences, delay critical investments, impact on stakeholder engagement and result in intended benefits not being realised.
